Colored _____, to serve _____ years, or during the war. On the Muster Roll of Co. _____ of that Regiment, for the months of _____, 186 _____, he is reported _____

On muster roll of Company "F" 24th U.S. Colored Troops for July and August 1865 Corporal Samuel Harman, is reported present.

Supposed to be the soldier inquired for as the name Samuel J. Harman, is not borne on the rolls of that company.

Company and regimental records do not show him absent August 1st 1865.

The regiment left Point Lookout Md. July 14th 1865, for Richmond Va. July 16th Camped at Manchester Va, left Manchester Va. July 26th for Burksville Va, where it was stationed August 31, 1865, Company "F" was detached from regiment July 14/65 and left guarding Govt. property at Point Lookout Md. to August 31, 1865.

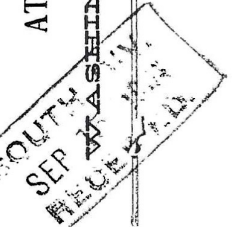

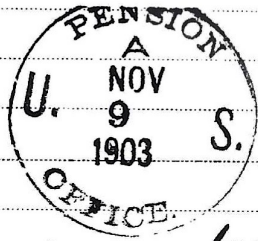
