Prominent Yardley Man Dead.

William J. Abrams, of Yardley, this county, died Monday morning at the age of 57 years. Mr. Abrams was one of the most respected citizens of Yardley. He was buried Wednesday afternoon. The interment was made at the Yardley cemetery. Mr. Abrams was one of the best known men in Bucks county. He was a sewing machine agent and harness maker in Yardley for many years. Then he succeeded his father-in-law, John Gerton, as supervisor of the Pennsylvania canal and for some fifteen years he had charge of work on that waterway from Bristol to New Hope. He served as councilman and school director of Yardley and held several other places of public interest. In politics he was an enthusiastic Bryan Democrat. Mr. Abrams recently resigned from the canal service because of ill health. He continued to fail in health until his death. A wife, a married daughter and two sons survive. The sons are Frank and John Abrams.
