

The Birmingham School's Anniversary.

A large audience, composed of the parents and friends of the school children, assembled at Granger's Hall, Trenton Junction, on Friday evening, the occasion being the anniversary exercises of the Birmingham school, which for a number of years has been under the care and management of Mrs. Martie Jerauld, one of Ewing's most popular teachers.
