EWING SCHOOL AFFAIRS. Cadwalader Place Children to Be Provided

For in the Townships.

The Ewing township authorities have made arrangements whereby the children of Cadwalader Place will not attend the

Trenton public schools next year, as they

are doing this year. The Cadwalader mansion, in Cadwalader Place, has been rented and here the township authorities will have a school conducted for the children of that locality. Mrs. Jerauld, now teaching the Trenton Junction school, will be in charge. A meeting of the legal voters of Ewing township will be held at Trenton Junction on Saturday afternoon, April 22, for the purpose of voting the necessary appropriation for the rental and the furnishing of the new school in the Cadwalader mansion, as well as for the payment of the teacher's salary. The meeting has been called for 4 o'clock and the polls will remain open for one hour. Women will be permitted to vote, as under the law they are entitled to such privilege at school elections when the matter to be decided is one of appropriating money. There is practically no question that the required

is one of appropriating money. There is practically no question that the required appropriation will be made, as under the arrangement decided upon by the township school board the expense of providing such a school for the Cadwalader Place children will not be as expensive as the present method of paying for the children's tuition in the Trenton schools. The transfer of Mrs. Jerauld from the Trenton Junction school will leave a vacancy at the latter place, which will be filled by transferring Miss Sortor from the Scudder's Falls school. Miss Hattle Fly of Yarlley has been engaged as the new leacher to take Miss Sortor's place at Scudder's Falls.
