

President's Message

The days are getting shorter, and the nights and mornings are cooler. It appears fall has arrived, but I'm not ready to start raking leaves and preparing the yard for winter. Halloween has come and gone, with many Trick or Treaters coming to our door; Veterans' Day, Thanksgiving, and the Holiday season are right around the corner. Please note on the November and December calendars the days the community center will be closed for Holiday observances.

Election day is Tuesday November 5th. Your vote is important, as the results of this election will shape the policies and direction of not only our Nation, but our State and Local Communities as well. One vote out of the millions that will be cast in the National election may seem insignificant, but the vote still matters. That one vote is even more important in the elections in our local communities.

The Lower Makefield Seniors membership is currently 280 people, less than 1% of the Township population. However, more than 25% of the residents of Lower Makefield Township are 65 or older. The "Seniors" can have a great impact on electing local officials who will make the needs of older citizens a priority of their public service. Talk to your friends and neighbors and encourage them to get out and vote for candidates who will act on our concerns.

The 2025 membership form is included with this newsletter. Please complete the form and return it to us by February 1, 2025. We will be updating our membership list in February to reflect the paid membership of our group. Due to the increase in the fees the Township is charging us to meet in the Community Center, the LMS Board made the difficult decision to significantly increasing our dues for 2025. Even with this increase, we project our total expenses will exceed our revenue by several thousand dollars. Deficit spending is not sustainable in the long run. We are looking into ways to increase our income and reduce expenses. Your ideas and suggestions to reduce this funding gap are welcome and encouraged.

You may not routinely participate in our weekly activities; a periodic attendance check suggests less than 1/2 of our members are at the center one or more days in any given week. I encourage you to attend our Meet & Greet meeting on November 12th to hear from a financial advisor from Merrill Lynch and find out about our activities and the latest news affecting our group.

We will be hosting our Holiday Luncheon at the Community Center on Wednesday, December11, 2024, starting at 11:30. The luncheon is in lieu of the December Meet & Greet, and there will be no Games Day activities on that date. The luncheon will be catered and served by AJ Catering and will include two entrees (chicken marsala, roast beef with gravy), baked ziti, stir fried vegetables, tossed salad, rolls, and dessert. Please return your reservation form and payment by December 1st.

Dear Seniors,

Sept. 26th we had a lovely day trip to Cape May, NJ. The sky's cleared as soon as we arrived making the day all the more enjoyable for the trolley ride, Emlen Physick Museum tour, and lunch at the Lobster House.

Nov. 21st we will be heading back to the American Music Theatre for their annual holiday show, "Joy To The World". This has proven to be such a popular venue that the bus was filled within a very short period of time. (We have a waiting list which we will use in the event of personal cancellation(s) may occur.)

The trip committee has been working very hard to ensure an itinerary of trips for next year. The following list is an initial roster of confirmed and potential 2025 trips:

1. March 18th (CONFIRMED) - All Star Productions @ Li Greci's Staaten /Staten Island: Italian Feast of St. Joseph (similar to Doolan's) includes a floor show, open bar, plus sit down meal. (Reservation forms will be available at a future date.)

3. June 26th (PENDING DATE CONFIRMATION) - CATS @ Fulton Theatre (Lancaster) plus lunch

4. July Monmouth Park Horse Racing (dates won't be available until the Park posts it's racing schedule). We did this in 2023 and many have asked for us to do it again.

5. August 14th (CONFIRMED) NJ Tropicana Casino Trip & Skyline Cruise - includes 1 hr. skyline cruise, \$20 slot play, \$15 food credit - free time.

6. October 2025 Fall is a wonderful time of year to view Pennsylvania's foliage. We are looking into a possible day trip to the quaint town of Jim Thorpe, PA. This will include lunch, a possible train ride, and free time for shopping or an optional museum visit.

7. December 11th 2025(CONFIRMED) - American Music Theatre - 2025 show -"Deck the Halls" and lunch.
