Officer Highlights

Testing His Limits: Officer Kevin Riley's Adventure On and Off Duty



For Lower Makefield Township Police Officer Kevin Riley, life is about testing his limits—in uniform, in the gym, and on the trail. Whether he's serving the community, raising six children, or hiking the rugged terrain of the Appalachian Trail, Kevin approaches every challenge with focus and determination.

Kevin didn't take the most direct route into law enforcement. Before joining the police force, he spent several years working in security and corrections. But at 29, he decided it was time to follow the path he had always wanted to take. "I realized one day that I wasn't doing what I loved," he said. "So, I made the change—and I've never looked back."

That decision set him on a steady course. After graduating from the Police Academy in 2015, Kevin gained valuable experience in a range of roles—from correctional facility security to patrol work in Bristol Borough and later as a Bucks County Ranger. Those years on the job helped shape his approach to policing: stay adaptable, stay motivated, and stay connected to the community.

In 2021, Kevin joined the Lower Makefield Township Police Department, where he quickly found his stride. The transition from small-town policing to a larger department felt natural. "Here, we have a great dynamic," he explained. "We're able to respond quickly and support each other while serving a community that truly values what we do."

When he's not on patrol or riding with the highway motorcycle unit, Kevin is often outdoors—usually with a backpack and a challenging trail ahead of him. A few years ago, he discovered his passion for hiking and hasn't stopped exploring since. "There's something about being out there—away from everything, under the stars—that's just therapeutic," he said.



His adventures have taken him to sections of the Appalachian Trail, where he hiked steep, rocky terrain in freezing temperatures with a 50-pound pack. "It was one of the hardest things I've ever done," he recalled, "but it's also one of the most rewarding."



Closer to home, Kevin enjoys local trails with his family and is planning a trip to Pennsylvania's "Grand Canyon." His dream destination is the high-altitude trails of Colorado—ideally with a few fellow officers. "It's great to have that camaraderie off-duty," he said. "We push each other, the same way we do on the job."

Balancing the demands of police work with raising six kids can be a challenge of its own. "It's chaos sometimes," he admitted with a smile, "but I wouldn't trade it for anything. My kids are outdoor kids too—they keep me moving."

Whether he's protecting residents or climbing a mountain, Officer Riley brings the same steady commitment and drive to everything he does. His story reflects the spirit of service, perseverance, and community pride that define Lower Makefield Township.



FIRE SERVICES

The Yardley-Makefield Fire Company responded to over 640 calls for service in 2025, varying from house fires, vehicle fires, hazardous conditions, and many other emergencies that the volunteer members handled. The number of calls for service has grown over the years from the expanding growth our community.



Community growth is great, but it also puts a toll on the emergency responders who protect the town. The fire company did see an increase in membership over the past year, but the number of available volunteers during the day is decreasing due to several factors that include working outside the area, conflicting schedules with spouses and kids' activities, and members who work from home unable to leave for emergencies a few times a day. This puts additional stress on the more senior volunteers who are retired and are available during the day, who, on average, are over the age of 65. The fire company is always looking for residents in the community who might be interested in joining. We can reach out via our website (www.yardleymakefieldfire.com). The Lower Makefield Township Office of the Fire Service Director was very busy in 2025 as well. The office conducted over 730 fire safety inspections, reviewed over 150 building plans for compliance with state and local fire codes, assisted in installing over 200 new smoke/carbon monoxide detectors, conducted over 25 car seat inspection/installations, conducted over 20 Fire Safety presentations ranging from Pre-Schoolers to the elderly, witnessed over 30 fire drills at schools and daycares, and handled numerous fire code complaints with the building code official. There were 116 emergency calls that required some type of fire investigation or code enforcement from the office. The office consists of one full-time fire director, two part-time fire inspectors, and four volunteer Deputy Fire Marshals. The Deputy Fire Marshals are volunteers from the fire company who assist with fire investigations and fire prevention activities. The office also assists the Yardley-Makefield Fire Company with many tasks that are needed to be done to ensure the fire company runs smoothly, such as equipment inventory, scheduling training, tracking members participation,

meeting vendors during the day, and handling daytime special events. Both the Yardley-Makefield Fire Company and Lower Makefield Township Office of the Fire Service Director work in unison to ensure the best possible fire service is provided to the residents and businesses of Lower Makefield Township.

Melted snow, budding trees, longer days: they're all signs that the warmer months are fast-approaching and for many of us, these seasonal hallmarks are reminders to start spring cleaning in and around our homes.

As people power up their lawnmowers, rake up debris, touch up chipped paint, and take on projects to get their homes and yards ready for the months ahead, the following are some key practices and supporting recommendations to help minimize the risk of fires and associated hazards:

Properly use and store gasoline

- Use gasoline only as motor fuel, never as a cleaner or to break down grease.
- Only store gasoline in a container that is sold for that purpose and never bring it indoors, even in small amounts.
- Never store gasoline containers in a basement or in the occupied space of a building. Keep them in a detached garage or an outdoor shed.
- Make sure the container is tightly capped when not in use.

Carefully dispose of rags with paint and stain

The oils commonly used in oil-based paint and stain release heat as they dry. If the heat is not released in the air as the rags dry, the heat is trapped, builds up and can cause a fire.

- Never leave cleaning rags in a pile. When you're finished using the rags, take them outside to dry, keeping them well away from the home and other structures.
- Hang rags outside or spread them on the ground and weigh them down so that they don't blow away.
- Put dried rags in a metal container, making sure the container is tightly covered. Fill the container with water / detergent solution, which will break down the oils.
- Keep containers of oily rags in a cool place out of direct sunlight and away from other heat sources.
- Inspect grills to ensure they're in good working order
- Inspect your grill carefully and make sure it's free of grease or fat buildup. Clean out any nests, spider webs, or other debris you may find.
- For propane grills, check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year.

Clean out your clothes dryer

- Make sure the air exhaust vent pipe for your dryer is not restricted and that the outdoor vent flap will open when the dryer is operating. This includes making sure the outdoor vent flap is not covered by snow.
- Move things that can burn, such as boxes, cleaning supplies and clothing, away from the dryer.
- Clothes that have encountered flammable substances like gasoline, paint thinner, or similar solvents should be laid outside to dry, then can be washed and dried as usual.

SHORT-TERM RENTAL INFORMATION

Are You Planning To Do Short-Term Rentals At Your House?

Before any dwelling unit is advertised for short-term lodging, the property owner shall obtain the required license from the Township. Short-term Lodging is only allowed in the following cases:

Specific Bedroom Accomodation. The owner of an owner-occupied single-family dwelling may rent no more than 2 bedrooms to transient visitors for a period of not less than 24 hours & not more than 30 consecutive days. Under this arrangement, the owner must occupy the residence during the stay of the transient visitor.

Entire Residential Unit Accomodation. An owner may rent a residential property which they own to transient visitors for a minimum period of 7 consecutive days, not to exceed 30 consecutive or nonconsecutive calendar days per year (each year shall be January 1 through December 31). Under this type of arrangement, the owner may, but is not required to, remain on the premises during the stay of the transient guests.

NOTICE TO ALL LENDERS, REALTORS, BUILDERS, & PROPERTY OWNERS

Lower Makefield Township provides assistance with flooding, drainage and structural retrofitting options, and helps in determining whether Township parcels are affected by floodplains. You should consider taking advantage of this service prior to planning a construction project, offering any property for sale, or considering buying a home.

KNOW YOUR RISK

The FEMA Flood Map Service Center (MSC) Search by Address feature enables you to enter an address, a place, or a set of longitude/latitude coordinates to find the effective flood map for that location.

After locating the flood map, you can view or download it, as well as view or download any Letters of Map Change (LOMC) issued for that flood map. You can quickly assess your flood risk using these online tools. We can assist you with using this service.



Lower Makefield Township Announces 2026 Pool Season Updates

Board of Supervisors Approves Member-Focused Changes

Lower Makefield Township Parks & Recreation is pleased to announce approved updates for the 2026 Pool Season, designed to enhance the member experience, maximize access during peak times, and respond directly to community feedback. Following a comprehensive review of staffing patterns, attendance data, and operational needs, the Parks and Recreation Board presented its recommendations at its October 14, 2025 meeting. The Board of Supervisors formally approved updated pool fees and operating hours on November 19, 2025, allowing families ample time to plan for the upcoming season.

What's New for the 2026 Pool Season

Several updates will take effect beginning with the 2026 season. Township residents will benefit from a new **Resident Household Membership cap of \$600**, ensuring that families living at the same address do not pay more than this amount for a full-season membership. Members who register during the Early-Bird period will receive a **10% discount**, reducing the household cap to **\$540**.

In response to member feedback requesting earlier notice of seasonal changes, registration will open **December 1, 2025**, providing residents with advance access to pricing, schedules, and membership requirements.

Operational adjustments have also been approved for the 2026 season. The pool will not operate on weekdays while the Pennsbury School District is in session. During those weeks, **weekend hours will open one hour earlier**, and **Friday and Saturday closing times will return to 9:00 PM during peak season**. These changes affect four of the fifteen operational weeks and are intended to improve access during the busiest times while maintaining safe, fully staffed operations.

Membership Registration and Fees

Registration for the 2026 Pool Season opens December 1, 2025, at <https://register.communitypass.net/LowerMakefield>. An Early-Bird Discount of 10% will be automatically applied to all memberships purchased between **December 1, 2025 and February 13, 2026**. Membership fees vary by age and residency, with reduced rates available for children, seniors, and August-only memberships. Children under one year of age are free. August-only memberships will be available beginning **July 13, 2026** and are valid from August 1 through Labor Day, excluding swim team participation.

Proof of residency is required for resident rates. A 10% military discount is available with valid identification; members should contact the Membership Office for details.

Membership Requirements and Access

All members must reside at the address listed on their account. Adults age 18 and older (before September 7, 2026) are required to submit a valid photo ID and signed legal disclaimer. Children under 18 must provide a birth certificate or proof of legal guardianship. All members age one and older (before May 23, 2026) must submit a clear headshot photo for identification purposes.

Documents and photos may be uploaded online or emailed to communitypool@lmt.org.

All members age one and older are required to use a key fob to access the Pool Complex. Photos will be verified at the gate upon entry. Some members may be required to update their photo this season to ensure accurate identification.

2026 Pool Hours and Schedule

The 2026 operating schedule reflects staffing availability, safety requirements, and attendance trends. Weekday hours will not be offered while school is in session, while weekend hours during those weeks will begin earlier. Friday and Saturday evenings will remain open until 9:00 PM during peak season.

Why These Changes Are Necessary

Lower Makefield Township employs more than 120 seasonal pool staff each year, the majority of whom are minors. State and federal labor laws limit how late younger employees may work during the school year. In addition, changes to the Pennsbury School District bell schedule delay student dismissal by approximately one hour, limiting weekday staff availability. Attendance data also shows significantly lower weekday usage while school is in session, supporting the need for these targeted schedule adjustments.

Additional Information

Same-day pool access requires all documentation to be received in person at the Community Center by 11:00 AM. Refund requests must be submitted in writing, with key fobs returned by **Friday, May 22, 2026**. Refunds will not be issued after this date. Administrative fees apply for membership changes, returned checks, and lost key fobs.

Guest passes, swim lessons, private lessons, and pavilion rentals are available for an additional fee. All swim team participants must hold an active pool membership.

5 STEPS *for Creating a Rain Garden*

Stormwater runoff is a major cause of water pollution in streams and rivers

Rain gardens are shallow depressions that are planted with deep-rooted native and non-native adaptive plants and grasses. They are:

- Designed to collect rain water that runs off rooftops or lawns
- Areas that capture stormwater runoff, allowing it to soak into the ground. This recharges groundwater and naturally filters out pollutants.
- A source of food and habitat for birds and butterflies

Creating a rain garden not only shows your interest in protecting the environment, but also can be a beautiful addition to a home landscape.



5 STEPS FOR CREATING A RAIN GARDEN

Step 1

Pick the spot

- Contact local utilities by calling 811 to have them mark locations of underground wires, cables, or pipes
- A rain garden should be at least 10 feet from foundations and fence posts, and 25 feet from septic system drain fields and well heads

Step 2

Outline garden and determine depth

- The average size of a home rain garden is 70 square feet (7 x 10 feet), but the size can vary based on how much water you want to catch
- Gardens should be no more than 6 to 12 inches deep
- Make sure the garden is not flat because you need a depression to capture water

Step 3

Select the plants

- Select native and non-native adaptive plants that can tolerate “wet feet” in the lowest places
- Determine how many plants are needed based on your rain garden size and the mature plant dimensions

Step 4

Dig in

- The depression in your rain garden should be marked and dug to the depth you determined in Step 2.
- Without a depression, the rain garden will not work.
- Make sure not to compact the soil - this is the leading cause of failed gardens
- Place each plant at its minimum distance from other plants

Step 5

Finish-Up

- Install mulch or sphagnum moss to keep weeds out and retain moisture
- Water the garden each day for the first week, and then gradually reduce watering over the next three weeks. After a month, normal rain should be enough to keep plants healthy.
- Regular maintenance is required to keep your rain garden looking good and functioning well

Tips for Managing Your Rain Garden

- Don't worry about mosquitoes. Your rain garden should not retain water long enough for mosquitoes to have an opportunity to breed
- Your rain garden will contain flow from light rains, however, will fill up and overflow during heavy rains
- You may direct your downspout to the rain garden by digging a shallow swale or by routing it through a drain pipe
- If your soil lacks organic material, you may dig the depression an additional 2 to 3 inches and fill in with peat moss or compost
- Be creative by adding decorative items such as stones and garden ornaments to enhance your rain garden

After the Storm: **POWER OUTAGE**



Use flashlights, not candles

This will avoid risk of fire. Turn on flashlights before entering buildings, to avoid producing a spark that could ignite leaking gas.



Practice portable generator safety

Use outdoors, at least 20 feet away from doors/windows/garages to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning. Properly ground, and don't overload.



Be careful with food and water

Food in the fridge can start to spoil after as little as 4 hours. Drink bottled/boiled water only, as purification systems may not be working. Use camp stoves/grills outdoors only.

After the Storm: **HAZARDS REMAIN**



Be careful near damaged buildings

Do not enter a damaged building until local authorities say it's safe. Leave your home if you hear shifting or unusual noises. If you smell gas, get outdoors immediately and call 911.



Watch out for power lines

Stay far away from damaged power lines, whether they've fallen to the ground or are dangling overhead.



Don't walk or drive through floodwater

They can contain harmful bacteria, chemicals, sharp objects, and reptiles/other animals. It only takes 12 inches of fast-moving water to sweep a car away.

A rain barrel can conserve water and save YOU money during peak summer months. Conserving water helps protect the environment, saves energy (decreased demand for treated tap water and well water) and decreased the impact of runoff to streams and the Delaware River. Therefore by installing a rain barrel YOU can help protect the water quality, aquatic species, drinking water quality, and recreation in the Delaware River watershed.

A formula to remember: 1 inch of rain on a 1,000 sq. ft. roof yields 623 gallons of water. Calculate the yield of your roof by multiplying the square footage of your roof by 623 and divide by 1,000.
