Stormwater Utility Fee Information and FAQ

What is Stormwater?

Stormwater is water that gathers from precipitation events including rain, snow, and sleet. When stormwater flows over surfaces like streets, rooftops, and lawns, it often picks up debris, chemicals, and other pollutants. This stormwater runoff is transported through the stormwater system and ultimately enters our local waterways untreated, affecting water quality.

Why has the importance and cost of stormwater management increased?

In the United States, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) regulates stormwater under the Clean Water Act (CWA). EPA allows portions of the CWA to be administered under the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System (MS4) Program. As part of our MS4 permit, Lower Makefield Township is faced with new unfunded mandates, resulting in the need to spend considerably more money than ever before to improve local water quality and address the requirements set forth by the PADEP.

How do I affect stormwater runoff?

Stormwater management involves managing rainwater that is not absorbed by our lawns and gardens. Impervious surfaces on your property such as driveways, sheds, patios, and buildings impact the quantity of stormwater runoff that is managed by Lower Makefield Township. Additionally, household tasks such as applying fertilizer or washing your car can have an impact on our water quality if that runoff enters the MS4.

MS4 Program

MS4 stands for “Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System”. This system includes basins, man-made channels, culverts, storm drains, and various other stormwater collection and conveyance facilities.

The MS4 program is federally mandated under the Clean Water Act and is managed by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP). The Township is designated as a small MS4 community and therefore is required to obtain a National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Phase II MS4 Permit through the PADEP.

The MS4 Permit is essential for managing water quality by regulating sources of pollution. It requires the Township to meet the requirements listed in the Minimum Control Measures (MCMs) and Pollutant Reduction Plan (PRP). To ensure we meet our NPDES permit requirements, the Township must submit an Annual MS4 Status Report to the PADEP by September 30th each year summarizing the activities completed.

What can I do to help?

You can make a difference and help us keep our local waters clean. Adopt a couple of clean water habits, such as:

- Picking up after your pets and disposing of their waste properly.
- Performing pool draining in a grassy area at a rate to not leave your property or enter the street.
- Applying fertilizer and pesticides in the proper amounts. Aside from costing more, excess fertilizers run off your lawn and into streams, where they can deprive aquatic species of proper oxygen levels.
- Washing vehicles at car washes or on surfaces where wash water can infiltrate into the ground.
- Keeping grass clippings and yard waste out of the street until leaf collection.
- Maintaining your vehicle properly, and most importantly, not dumping oil or any type of fluid down storm drains.
- Disposing of trash properly, litter washes away with stormwater and can be ingested by fish, birds, or other wildlife.

Stormwater Utility Fee Overview

Lower Makefield Township was mandated by the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP) to complete a variety of projects to meet the Pollutant Reduction Plan (PRP) requirements for the purpose of improving water quality of local creeks, streams, and waterways. These projects will be implemented throughout the Township to manage stormwater and reduce pollutants before it is discharged to our local waterways. In addition to meeting regulatory requirements, aging and deteriorating infrastructure is a major concern for the Township.

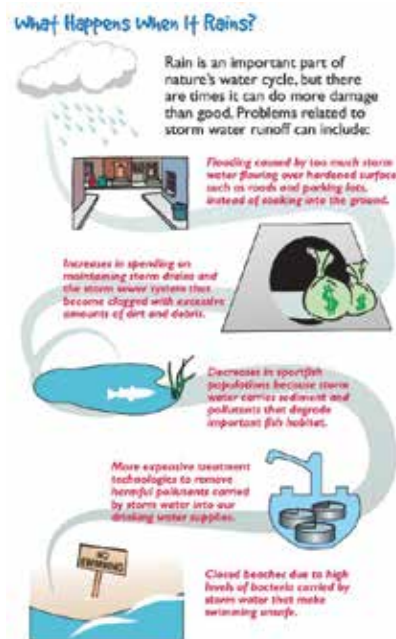
To meet this mandate and fund the repair and replacement of infrastructure, a Stormwater Utility Fee was implemented in 2026, with the average residential property paying \$8.50/month. The fee is based on the amount of impervious area (IA) on a property within the Township.

The fee will be assessed as follows:

Tier 0	<300	No Fee Assessed
Tier 1	300-4,999	\$8.50
Tier 2	5,000+	Varies – Monthly Fee of \$2.90/1,000 sf of IA (Rounded up to next 1,000)

Billing Information

The Stormwater Utility Fee will be billed by Lower Makefield Township to all properties with over 300 sf of Impervious Area. A stormwater bill will be issued annually; however, you may elect to pay this bill quarterly. These bills will be mailed by the Township.

Behind the Badge – A Conversation with Officer Keith Golder!

I made one of the best decisions of my life in 2006 - to accept the position for Police Officer in Lower Makefield Township. It is hard to believe it's been 20 years since then. I work with some great people; they aren't just coworkers - they're great friends who stood by me without question. I wouldn't change a thing. Wearing the badge means a lot to me, it means service, commitment, honor and pride - knowing that I'm the guy giving everything to protect and serve others.

I started my career in 2001 as a part-time officer in New Hope Borough. I spent six years as a full-time officer for the Borough, also working part time for the Solebury Township Police Department. Then, in 2006 I joined the Lower Makefield Township Police Department. In 2010, I was a member of the South-Central Emergency Response team as a Tactical Operator and was a part of the team for 15 years.

If I'm being real, I would want the residents to know that this job isn't just something I clock in and out of, it's who I've been for most of my life. I didn't choose this path by accident; I grew up around it. Growing up, I saw what it meant to serve but also what it took out of you. Knowing all of this, though, I still chose it and will continue to do so. What people don't always see is that behind the badge I'm just like them. I have a family and people I care about. I have had good days, and I have had some really hard ones, especially over the last few years. This job changes you; it affects how you see the world and how you carry yourself and even how you feel things. But, at the core of it, I care more than people probably realize on every call I receive. Whether the call is something big or something small, I will always go because that is someone's life, and in that moment, I do not take that lightly.

When it comes to the department, we have good people that work here and do the job the right way. People who show up every day and put the uniform on. They try to make a difference even when it's not easy and even when it feels like it's not appreciated. Law enforcement as a whole is complicated, and there is no easy way to explain this job unless you've experienced it. You are expected to make the right decision in situations that are tense, emotional, and sometimes dangerous, and those decisions are judged long after the moment is passed. This does not mean we should not be held accountable, we should be, but there also needs to be an understanding of what the job really is. We are all just trying to do it the right way.



If I could ask anything from the community, it would be to talk to us and get to know us beyond the uniform. Rather than only seeing the uniform, see the person wearing it for who they are, because at the end of the day, we're a part of this community too. We want the same things you do - safety, stability, and a place where our family can feel secure.

What does wearing the badge mean for me? Personally, the badge shows a lot of things about me. I'm continuing a legacy in my family; my grandfather and my two brothers share the same responsibility. The badge represents trust, and the community trusts that we will show up when things go wrong. It represents sacrifice, long nights, missing holidays and time away from family. Most of all, the badge represents service, helping people who can't help themselves and protecting those who need it.

What advice would I give to a young person who is looking to pursue a career in law-enforcement? There are a few things I would say, but most importantly, know your "why". Do the job because you want to serve people on their worst days and help try to make things better. Integrity is everything and your reputation will follow you. During your career, always do the right thing even when no one

is watching and learn how to talk to people. The best officers are ones who can communicate with those they are serving, and many times, most situations can be solved with calm words. This job will show you things that most people never see, so take care of your mental health. It is so important to make sure you don't take the job home with you. Be proud of the job and the role you play in the community, but don't let it become your whole identity.

Life after the badge, I'll catch up on a lot of sleep and spend more time with my family and friends. I can see a lot of golf in the future.

On December 23, 2025, at approximately 2:22 PM, an explosion occurred at a nursing/healthcare facility in nearby Bristol Township. FIRE SERVICES

The fire company responded to over 630 calls for service in 2025, varying from house fires, vehicle fires, hazardous conditions, and many other emergencies that the company members handled. This number of calls for service has grown over the years from the expanding growth our community is having. Community growth is great, but it also puts a toll on the emergency responders that protect the town. All our members are volunteers who are your neighbors, friends, and relatives. The company strives to provide top notch service to the community by ensuring members are nationally trained and ready to handle any type of emergency. Volunteerism is struggling due to rising fuel and consumer prices, house prices are constantly rising, and families are constantly busy with children and after school activities. The fire company is always looking for residents in the community who might be interested in joining to reach out via our website (www.yardleymakefieldfire.com).



The fire company would like to provide some summer fire safety tips to everyone:

Make sure your gas grill is working properly

- Leaks or breaks are primarily a problem with gas grills. Check the gas tank hose for leaks before using it for the first time each year.
- If your grill has a gas leak detected by smell or the soapy bubble test, and there is no flame, turn off both the gas tank and the grill. If the leak stops, get the grill serviced by a professional before using it again. If the leak does not stop, call the fire department.
- If you smell gas while cooking, immediately get away from the grill and do not move it. If the flame goes out, turn the grill and gas off and wait at least 5 minutes before re-lighting it.

Never leave equipment unattended

- Make sure to closely monitor food cooking on the grill. Turn the grill off promptly when you are done cooking and let it cool completely before returning it to its original location.
- For campfires, fire pits, and chimineas, always have a hose, bucket of water, or shovel and dirt or sand nearby, and make sure the fire is completely out before going to sleep or leaving the area.

Keep equipment a safe distance from things that can burn

- Place your grill at least 3 feet from anything that can burn, including deck railings and overhanging branches; also keep them out from under eaves.
- Keep portable grills a safe distance from lawn games, play areas and foot traffic.
- Keep children and pets well away from any type of equipment in use.
- In areas where campfires are permitted, they must be at least 25 feet away from any structure and anything that can burn. Make sure to clear away dry leaves and sticks, overhanging low branches and shrubs.

Use fuel and fire starters properly

- If you use a starter fluid to ignite charcoals, use only charcoal starter fluid. Never add charcoal fluid or any other flammable liquids to the fire.
- Keep charcoal fluid out of the reach of children and away from heat sources.
- Never use gasoline or other flammable or combustible liquids on firepits, chimineas, or campfires.
- For electric charcoal starters, which do not use fire, make sure the extension cord you are using is designed for outdoor use.

If a fire breaks out, call the fire company

- For any type of outdoor fire that can't be quickly and effectively extinguished, call the fire company immediately for assistance.

FINANCE

The Finance Department would like to share an update regarding recent organizational changes that directly align with the Strategic Management Planning Program (STMP) the Township engaged in during the end of 2025. These updates reflect a strategic move toward operational efficiency within the Finance Department.

Finance Department Structure

Mega Bhandary – Chief Financial Officer (CFO)

As the Chief Financial Officer, Mega Bhandary oversees all financial operations of the Township and provides strategic financial leadership.

Key responsibilities include:

- Overall management of the Finance Department
- Long-term financial planning, budgeting, and forecasting
- Oversight of accounting, payroll, HR, benefits, and accounts payable functions
- Financial reporting to the Board of Supervisors and Township Manager
- Debt management, investments, and capital planning
- Ensuring compliance with laws, regulations, and best practices in municipal finance
- Supporting organizational modernization and operational efficiency

Alison Stewart – Finance and HR Manager

Alison Stewart is responsible for payroll, human resources, benefits administration, and related personnel functions. Her role ensures employees are paid accurately and on time, benefits are administered efficiently, and the Township remains compliant with employment laws and union agreements.

Key responsibilities include:

- Bi-weekly payroll processing, time and attendance, wage changes, and leave tracking
- Administration of employee benefits (health, pension, insurance, 457 plans, etc.)
- Workers' compensation, property, and liability claim coordination
- Union contract implementation and compliance
- Employee onboarding, personnel records, HR compliance, and training coordination
- Payroll and HR reporting, system improvements, and organizational modernization

Stephanie McDonald – Accountant

Stephanie McDonald is responsible for a broad range of general accounting functions, including accounts receivable, journal entries, bank reconciliations, developer escrow accounting, and fixed asset management. She supports the Chief Financial Officer with external audits and other accounting-related projects as requested.

Key responsibilities include:

- Reviewing, coding, and recording daily cash receipts and reconciling monthly cash activity
- Producing Township billings, including police overtime, program fees, fuel usage, false alarm fines, rent, and late fees
- Preparing year-end accounts receivable reports for audit purposes
- Maintaining fixed asset records, including asset additions and disposals
- Managing developer escrow accounts, billing, collections, and monthly reporting
- Coordinating with the Community Development Department on escrow-related vendor billings
- Preparing and posting journal entries and completing monthly bank reconciliations in accordance with GAAP
- Preparing audit schedules and supporting documentation and assisting with annual financial, liquid fuels, and pension audits

Kimberly Johnson – Accounts Payable

Kimberly is responsible for managing the Township's accounts payable functions and ensuring timely and accurate payment of vendor invoices.

Key responsibilities include:

- Processing invoices and vendor payments
- Maintaining vendor records and responding to payment inquiries
- Ensuring proper approvals and documentation for expenditures
- Supporting compliance with purchasing policies and internal controls
- Assisting with reconciliations and audit support as needed

These changes are intended to strengthen financial operations, improve accountability, and ensure clear lines of responsibility across the organization.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

Lower Makefield Township encourages residents to understand flood risk in their area and prepare if necessary.

Are You Planning To Do Short-Term Rentals At Your House?

Before any dwelling unit is advertised for short-term lodging, the property owner shall obtain the required license from the Township. Short-term Lodging is only allowed in the following cases:

Specific Bedroom Accommodation. The owner of an owner-occupied single-family dwelling may rent no more than 2 bedrooms to transient visitors for a period of not less than 24 hours & not more than 30 consecutive days. Under this arrangement, the owner must occupy the residence during the stay of the transient visitor.

Entire Residential Unit Accommodation. An owner may rent a residential property which they own to transient visitors for a minimum period of 7 consecutive days, not to exceed 30 consecutive or nonconsecutive calendar days per year (each year shall be January 1 through December 31). Under this type of arrangement, the owner may, but is not required to, remain on the premises during the stay of the transient guests.

NOTICE TO ALL LENDERS, REALTORS, BUILDERS, & PROPERTY OWNERS

Lower Makefield Township provides assistance with flooding, drainage and structural retrofitting options, and helps in determining whether Township parcels are affected by floodplains. You should consider taking advantage of this service prior to planning a construction project, offering any property for sale, or considering buying a home.

We can arrange to meet with you or visit your property to assess any flooding issues you may have. If you need assistance or have any questions, please stop into the Community Development Department at the Township offices or contact us at 267-274-1123 to speak with our Professional Engineers and Certified Floodplain Managers.

KNOW YOUR RISK

The FEMA Flood Map Service Center (MSC) Search by Address feature enables you to enter an address, a place, or a set of longitude/latitude coordinates to find the effective flood map for that location.

After locating the flood map, you can view or download it, as well as view or download any Letters of Map Change (LOMC) issued for that flood map. You can quickly assess your flood risk using these online tools. We can assist you with using this service.

1. Know Your Flood Risk.

- Find out the history and extent of past flooding in your area. Township staff can advise you as to whether a property is in a high-risk or moderate-to-low risk area, the base flood elevation and the mandatory flood insurance purchase requirements.
- You can learn about your flood risk by visiting the Lower Makefield Township Building to view the currently effective Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs), or by viewing the DFIRMs at FEMA Map Service Center: <https://msc.fema.gov/portal/home> and entering the address of the property.
- Township staff can tell you about the causes of repetitive flooding, what the Township is doing about it, what would be an appropriate flood protection level, or visit your property to discuss flood protection alternatives.

2. Prepare for Flooding by Doing the Following:

- Make a disaster response plan. See the FEMA website at <https://www.ready.gov/plan> for information about preparing your home and family for a disaster.

- Know how to shut off electricity and gas to your house when a flood comes.
 - Make a list of emergency numbers and identify a safe place to go to.
 - Safeguard possessions: Make a household inventory, take photos or videos and store them at a higher level.
 - Put all insurance policies, valuable papers, medicine, etc. in a safe place, away from flood waters.
 - Collect and put cleaning supplies, cameras, waterproof boots, etc. in a handy place.
 - Get a copy of *Repairing Your Flooded Home* & other publications found on the Township website: <https://www.lmt.org/public-safety/delaware-river-flood-info-and-insurance/>

3. Consider Some Permanent Flood Protection Measures.

- Mark your fuse or breaker box to show the circuits to the floodable areas. Turning off the power to the basement before a flood can reduce property damage & save lives.
- Consider elevating your house above flood levels.
- Check your building for water entry points, such as basement windows, the basement stairwell, doors, and dryer vents. These can be protected with low walls or temporary shields.
- Install a floor drain plug, standpipe, overhead sewer, or sewer backup valve to prevent sewer backup flooding.
- More information can be found on FEMA's website www.ready.gov/floods.
- Note that some flood protection measures may need a building permit and others may not be safe for your type of building, so be sure to talk to the Township Building Department.

4. Talk to the Township about Financial Assistance

- There are a variety of funding sources to help mitigate flood prone properties, including: Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP), Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA), Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities (BRIC). If certain criteria are met, most of the

FEMA grants provide 75% of the cost of the project. The owner is expected to fund the remaining 25%.

- Find out more about funding programs that are appropriate for your situation by visiting the website: <http://www.fema.gov/hazard-mitigation-assistance>
- Residents may be eligible for Increased Cost of Compliance (ICC) assistance, which is a resource for flood insurance policyholders who need additional help rebuilding after a flood.

5. Get a Flood Insurance Policy:

- Flood insurance will help pay for repairs after a flood and, in some cases, help pay for the costs of elevating a substantially damaged building.
- Homeowners insurance policies do not cover damage from a flood. Because our community participates in the National Flood Insurance Program, you can purchase a separate flood insurance policy. This insurance is backed by the Federal government and is available to everyone, even properties that have been flooded. Since our community participates in the Community Rating System, you will receive a 15% reduction on the insurance premium.
- Don't wait to buy flood insurance protection. In most cases, there is a 30-day waiting period before the National Flood Insurance Program coverage takes effect.
- Policies are available for rental properties.
- You can use the new Direct-to-Consumer Flood Insurance Quote Tool to get a quote in 10 minutes or less at: <https://www.floodsmart.gov/policy-quote>
- Contact your insurance agent for more information on rates and coverage.

6. Construction and alteration projects in the floodplain MAY trigger the need for permits not normally issued to properties outside of the floodplain. Call us to determine if permits are necessary for your project.

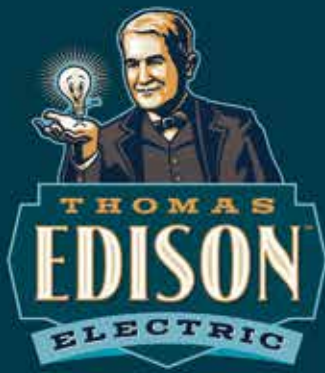
